Youth Apprenticeship (YA) integrates school-based + work-based learning to instruct students in employability + occupational skills defined by WI industries.

YA is available to juniors + seniors working with qualified teachers + skilled worksite mentors at a participating area employer. One credit is awarded each year enrolled in YA.

Youth Apprenticeship Opportunities

- Explore career options in specific industries while in high school:
 - Agriculture
 - Construction
 - Arts, A/V Tech + Comm
 - Finance
 - Health Science
 - Hospitality
 - Information Technology
 - Manufacturing
 - Marketing
 - STEM
 - Transportation
- Join the workforce to gain experience + earn money
- After graduation, move straight into the workforce, registered apprenticeship, military, or continue your education
- Give back to the community by contributing to the need for workforce as identified by our community partners
- Receive regular feedback about your workplace performance
- Earn industry-recognized certifications

Become a Youth Apprentice

1. Get prepared + apply to Youth Apprenticeship

Talk with your parent / guardian, consider a job shadow through Pathway Partners Mentoring Program to learn more about your career interest, then complete a YA application available on the MHS CTE webpage + in the school counseling office

2. Apply + interview with area employers in chosen industries

If accepted into YA, you are eligible to apply + interview at an area employer in the industry where you're looking to gain experience – MACCI can help!

3. Participate in all employer orientations + safety trainings

After a successful interview in this competitive program, you will complete registration paperwork + participate in onsite orientation + meet your mentor

4. Participate in regular progress reviews

Complete your industry specific YA requirements as you work + complete related instruction

5. Complete industry specific classroom + worksite YA requirements

Once all your requirements are complete, receive your Certificate of Occupational Proficiency from WI Department of Workforce Development

Youth Apprenticeship Requirements

Level One

- Junior / Senior Year
- Minimum 450 work hours
- 2 semesters related instruction
- Meet checklist competencies

Level Two

- Junior + Senior Year
- Minimum 900 work hours
- 4 semesters related instruction
- Meet checklist competencies
