The School District of Marshfield has a lot to be thankful for – our amazing students and families, a supportive community, strong administrative guidance, and outstanding teachers and staff – all working together to provide an excellent education for our students.

As the Covid-19 pandemic turned life upside down, our gratitude for teachers and staff grew as they adapted, persevered and were flexible in learning new ways to reach our students. Our student families were impacted in a myriad of ways with lost jobs and income, new childcare challenges, separation from extended family and friends, canceled travel and much more. Some dealt with illness from Covid-19 or other health issues, as well as disrupted healthcare. Some dealt with loss. It will only be made with lots of expert advice on how to best mitigate these risks. Plans must allow for some individual student needs and contain contingencies for changed circumstances. We are facing a fluid situation, and may need to adapt to that as we move forward.

The school board would like to thank teachers and administrators for the many summer hours they are putting in so that student learning can take place no matter how the public health situation unfolds. We are also grateful to all our district employees who are adapting to get our students back to school.

We appreciate our school families and the communities we serve. We need to work with you to keep our schools open. If a student has a fever, respiratory or other symptoms, or lives with someone who has Covid-19, that student should not come to school until medically cleared or recovery is complete. Every community member should do their part to control the spread of this virus with the simple proven habits of hand washing, social distancing and wearing a mask when there is indoor or close contact with those outside of your household. Some weeks remain before the 2020-21 school year begins. This can be a time to reinforce these habits for adults and children.
