

IF YOU OR YOUR FAMILY LIVES IN ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SITUATIONS:

- Doubled up with other people due to loss of housing or economic hardship
- In a shelter
- In a motel or campground due to lack of alternative housing options
- In a car, park, abandoned building, or other inadequate housing

You may qualify for certain rights and protections under the McKinney-Vento Act.

ELIGIBLE STUDENTS AND FAMILIES HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- A free and appropriate public education
- Immediate enrollment in school
- Choice to continue in school of origin (the school attended when permanently housed) or local school
- Transportation to and from school of origin, if requested
- Assistance with school fees and referrals to other community resources
- Free meals at school
- Educational services comparable to other students
- Dispute eligibility, placement, and enrollment decisions by contacting a School Social Worker

If you believe you may be eligible, contact your local school liaison to find out about eligibility and supports available. There may be supports available for preschool-age children.
