

ADDITIONAL ACADEMIC SUPPORTS AT MHS



INFORMATION: Recognizing that our students have diverse learning styles and may need additional support throughout the school year, MHS is proud to offer a variety of additional academic supports and programs designed to cater to individual student needs. Information pertaining the various academic supports and programs are outlined below.

30 MINUTE “FLEX” OFFERINGS AVAILABLE ON FLEXTIME

WHAT?	From academic remediation, student enrichment, and everything in between! Through the use of FlexTime Manager App, students are provided an opportunity to customize their daily schedule by selecting 30-minute flex activities offered by the student's academic teachers. Likewise, professional staff can use FlexTime Manager to request students for required instructional time, remediation, re-teaching content, conferencing, and more. Students and staff will use FlexTime Manager daily, to ensure flex periods 4A-4B and 4C are scheduled accordingly, including when students are assigned a 30 minute lunch period. Knowing that individual student needs, interests, course content and demands may change throughout the school year, FlexTime Manager App provides students and staff a flexible approach to supporting all learners.
WHEN?	Students are required to sign up for “flex” offering/s, daily before 9:30 AM. There will be a daily reminder for students to do so.
WHERE?	Reporting location is dependent on student's schedule, assigned teachers and the offering selected.
HOW IT WORKS	Students log into FlexTime Manager App and sign up for available “flex” offerings each week. Teacher requests will be prioritized over student selections. Students who do not select flex offerings will be automatically assigned a location.

ACADEMIC RESOURCE CENTER (A.R.C)

WHAT?	The Academic Resource Center (A.R.C) offers students additional instructional support in core subjects: Math, Science, English, and Social Studies. Certified professionals from each department will staff the A.R.C classrooms throughout the school day.
WHEN?	Occurs daily during the 79-minute class periods, typically during a student's scheduled study hall time.
WHERE?	The Academic Resource Centers are located in the Library Media Center (LMC).
HOW IT WORKS	All students are welcome to attend; walk ins welcome! Through the A.R.C referral process, some students may be assigned and required to report to the A.R.C during their 79-minute study hall/s. Referred students may be prompted to become independent in checking and monitoring their grades, self-advocacy, determining goals, organizing materials, and prioritizing tasks related to specific courses.

TESTING CENTER/QUIET LEARNING CENTER

WHAT?	The Testing Center is a quiet learning environment available to students to use during their 79-minute study hall and before and after school. This location is primarily for students who need to take assessments or seeking a quieter space to learn.
WHEN?	The Testing Center is open M-W-F from 7:00 AM to 3:15 PM and T-Th from 7:45 AM to 4:00 PM unless otherwise posted. Students primarily use the Testing Center during a student's 79-minute study hall unless otherwise requested by a student's teacher.
WHERE?	Room 62 at Marshfield High School.
HOW IT WORKS	Students may use the Testing Center to make up various course work, including assessments and other coursework requirements. This room serves as a resource for students to use in the event students need to take an assessment or make up coursework due to an excused absence.

PAPER TUTORING APP (ONLINE)

WHAT?	The “Paper Tutoring App” ensures students have access to 24/7 to live help, essay reviews, and real-time teacher feedback. This online resource empowers students to seek support even outside regular school hours, bridging the gap when teachers may not be readily available, such as during the weeknights or weekends.
WHEN?	24/7
WHERE?	Online
HOW IT WORKS	Students can access the Paper App by going to “MyApps” and select “Paper”.
