I. Registration Overview

- 1. Skyward Registration will be completed during Tiger Time February 22nd 25th.
- 2. Review 4 year plan through the Xello Course Planner
 - In your account under "Goals & Plans" -> "Course Planner".
- 3. Review the <u>course catalog</u> for required classes, prerequisite information, etc.
- 4. Discuss choices with teachers, counselors, parents, and/or siblings.
- 5. Check out the Tiger Course Hunt Video on the MHS Website.
- 6. Complete the <u>course planning guide</u> (PDF) and bring with you to Tiger Time on your cohort day Feb 22nd 25th.
- 7. Have you earned credit for: Healthy Choices, Fit for Life, and Computer Applications?
- 8. Have you passed the Civics Exam? If not, <u>email your counselor</u>.
- 9. Failed a class along the way? Please <u>email your counselor</u> to learn about options.

II. Course Planning Guide (PDF)

- A. Register for 6.5 credits minimally, 9.0 maximum (not including summer school). Consider the value of a study hall.
- B. Required courses:

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- i. English III: Regular, Honors, AP Language and Composition, AS Oral & Interpersonal Communication, English III Foundations by teacher/counselor recommendation only.
- ii. Social Science: World Studies R, AP European History, or AP World History. World Studies Foundations by teacher/counselor recommendation only.
 - 1. SS Electives do not count for year-long credit.
- iii. Physical Education: 1.5 credits required for graduation. Students who take Aquatics are eligible for lifeguard certification if they pass the skills test (LG605)
 - 1. PE must be taken over three years, not in the same year.
 - 2. Summer Strength & Conditioning over 3 summers earns elective credit only
- iv. Consumer & Personal Finance: Take junior or senior year, or summer school.
 - 1. AP Economics also counts for this credit
- v. Science: You need three credits to graduate.
 - 1. One credit of agriculture classes can be used for science credit.
 - 2. ES Principles of Engineering counts for 1 credit.
- vi. Math: You need three credits to graduate.
 - 1. EM Digital Electronics counts for 1 credit.
- C. World Languages
 - i. If you are planning to attend a four year university, it is recommended that you take at least two years of the same language. UW-Madison requires 3 years.
- D. Early Bird Courses (EB)
 - i. Courses that typically run EB are: AP Economics, Algebra II Honors, Jazz Band, Orchestra/Winds/Percussion
 - ii. These courses only run if enough students sign up for them.
 - iii. If you sign up for a course and it does not run EB, it will be put into your regular schedule unless you see your counselor about dropping it.
- E. Course Name Changes
 - i. See Art Department Changes

- F. Co-ops, Internships, and Youth Apprenticeships
 - i. Make sure you have completed all required prerequisites and meet GPA minimum.
 - ii. One-year youth apprenticeship <u>applications</u> should be returned to Mrs. Frederick. See Youth Apprenticeship information on page 14 of the course catalog.
 - iii. All applications are due ASAP to Mrs. Frederick
 - iv. Attendance is key
 - v. Health Career Connections
 - 1. DC Medical Terminology is a requirement for Health Career Connections.
 - 2. Interview for HCC during junior year.
 - 3. Complete CNA course before senior year or during, internships available at businesses such as Bent's Chiropractic, Marshfield Medical Centers, Dental Clinic of MFLD, etc.

III. Summer School

- A. All SS information is posted on the **Summer School Website**. Summer School is from June 14th to July 23.
- B. You may only miss five days for any reason.
- C. Registration will be through Student Skyward via the Arena Scheduling Tab and is available on Tuesday, February 18th at 4 pm for current sophomores. Please review the <u>how-to video</u> posted on the website.
- D. Seats fill on a first-come, first-served basis. See Mrs. Burkhart in the counselor's office for waitlist information if you do not get a seat at sign up time.
- E. You may only choose 2 classes for summer school. Summer school maximum is 1 credit.
- F. Summer school class options for future juniors

IV. Things to Remember:

- A. Review the acceptable reasons for schedule changes carefully in the <u>course catalog</u>.
- B. If you sign up for an honors or AP class, you are expected to stay in that class until the first quarter ends (9 weeks).
- C. Please check the prerequisites for all requested courses.
- D. Please register for at least three alternate classes. Typically these are semester electives.
- E. Many elective courses require that you pay a fee to cover your course materials. These fees are listed under the course descriptions in the course catalog.
