Sophomore 2021-2022 Registration

- I. Registration Overview
 - A. Review 4 year plan through the Xello Course Planner
 - B. Review teacher recommendations in Skyward
 - 1. *will appear next the the class recommended
 - C. Review the Course Catalog available on the high school website.
 - D. Discuss choices with parents, counselors, teachers, and/or siblings.
 - E. Access the Tiger Course Hunt Videos on the MHS homepage. These videos will help you learn about the sequencing, rigor, and content of the courses at MHS.
 - F. Complete the fillable course planning guide that was emailed to you. Have this course planning guide available when you enter your course requests into Skyward during Tiger Time the week of February 22.
- II. Credit Reminders
 - A. You need to sign up for a minimum of 6.5 credits. The maximum number of credits you can take in a normal school day is 8 and you will have no study hall. If you take an early bird class, you may take up to 9 credits with no study hall.
 - B. You may take up to 1 credit in summer school. (you earn the Strength and Conditioning .5 elective credit during the third summer)
- III. Transcript Evaluation
 - A. Have you earned credit for: Healthy Choices, Fit for Life, and Computer Applications?
 - B. Retake any failed required courses
 - C. Check graduation requirements in the Course Catalog or Career Cruising
- IV. Required courses
 - A. Science: You need at least three credits to graduate
 - 1. You may earn 1 credit of science through completion of ES Principles of Engineering or ES agriculture classes. In the end, 2.0 science credits must come from the science department and the final 1.0 science credit could come from ES Agriculture classes or ES Principles of Engineering.
 - B. Math: You need at least three credits to graduate
 - 1. Refer to the Math Pathways in the Course Catalog
 - 2. EM Digital Electronics also counts as one math credit towards graduation.
 - C. English Options: English II Foundations, English II Regular, English II Honors, AP Language and Composition. English II Foundations is only an option through a teacher recommendation.
 - D. Social Science Options: APUSH, The American Republic R, The American Republic Foundations (only an option with a teacher recommendation)
 - E. Select one Physical Education class.
 - 1. Students must be involved in a physical education class for three out of four high school years. Summer school counts in the following school year. You may take additional physical education classes, but they will count as electives. (Strength and Conditioning counts as elective credit, **not** as PE credit)
 - 2. Students who take Aquatics are eligible for lifeguard certification if they pass the skills test. If you are interested in the lifeguard certification, please select LG605 Aquatics.

- V. World Languages
 - A. World Languages are not a high school graduation requirement. However, if you are planning to attend a 4-year college, it is highly recommended that you take at least two years of the same foreign language.
 - 1. UW Madison states 3 years recommended to be competitive for admissions
- VI. Early Bird Courses
 - A. Early Bird options for 10th grade students include: Jazz Band (757), Orchestra Winds and Percussion H (759), and Algebra 2 H (EB208)
 - B. These courses will only run based on student enrollment.
 - C. If you sign up for a course and it does not run Early Bird, it will be put into your regular schedule unless you see your counselor about dropping it.
 - D. Typically if you are enrolled in an Early Bird class, you will usually be able to leave school for period 9.
- VII. Summer School Registration
 - A. Review the information found on the <u>Summer School 2021</u> link found on the high school website.
 - B. Summer school class options for sophomores may include: Fit for Life, Healthy Choices, Computer Applications H, Driver's Education, Sports Challenge: Team Challenges, Sports Medicine I, Strength and Conditioning(elective credit only), and Tailor Made Math.
 - C. If you are interested in Driver's Education, complete the required registration card in the counseling office or online before Wednesday, February 17.
 - D. Summer school classes begin June 14 and conclude July 23.
 - E. If you are interested in summer school, please review the <u>attendance policy</u>.
 - F. Students may only earn 1 credit each summer (Students may only sign up for a maximum of two summer school classes)
 - G. Summer school registration will be through Skyward Student via the Arena Scheduling Tab.
 - H. The online summer school registration link will open for 10th grade students on Wednesday, February 24 at 4:00 p.m.
 - I. Summer school classes will be filled on a first come, first serve basis.
 - J. After registration closes, there will be a waiting list in the MHS counseling office for classes that are filled.
- VIII. Things to remember:
 - A. Students are not allowed to make course level changes during the first quarter. If you sign up for an honors class, you are expected to stay in that class for at least one quarter.
 - B. You apply for the Health Career Connections program the fall of your junior year. If you are interested in this program, please make sure you are working on the prerequisites.
 - C. If you are interested in starting one of the youth apprenticeship programs your junior year, please make sure you are taking the prerequisites.
 - D. Locker Partner sign-up will occur this spring.
 - E. Many elective courses require that you pay a fee to cover your course materials. These fees are listed under the course descriptions in the course catalog.
 - F. Please check the prerequisites for all requested courses.
