JUNE SESSION - All courses held at Marshfield High School

3 WEEK COURSE OFFERINGS - Monday, June 15th – Thursday, July 2nd (No classes on Friday, July 3rd)

Multimedia Art – 7:30 a.m.-9:45 a.m. – Ms. Tarrah Pagel

In this course, you will create your own expressive art masterpieces in jewelry, handmade paper, printmaking techniques, fibers, metals and objects found in nature. You will learn how to combine metal and polymer clay with other media to create mixed-media works that are truly one-of-a-kind. Be ready to explore, create, and become a "Multimedia Maniac!"

Math Is Everywhere - 7:30-9:45 or 9:50-12:05 – Ms. Brandi Reed

Students will solve problems, analyze data, and make models to explain their mathematical thinking. This course integrates proportional reasoning, probability, linear relationships, and the ability to question mathematical concepts. Activities such as creating a bridge with spaghetti that holds some weight in which students collect data and create a scatter plot, coin toss probability, questioning the Order of Operation, making a 3D fractal. Each day we will start with a Brain Question or short math game.

Students will explore the use of watercolor, acrylic, and tempera to study color and design in painting. Students are encouraged to create original artworks to define their ideas and style.

Grade 8 Math – Pre-Algebra: This is an online course offering – Ms. Brandi Reed

Grade 8 Math is an Online Math Course that focuses on three critical areas: formulating and reasoning about expressions and equations, grasping the concept of a function and using functions to describe quantitative relationships, analyzing two- and three-dimensional space and figures using distance, angle, similarity, and congruence. Students will understand and apply the Pythagorean Theorem. This class is open to all current seventh-grade students. Students successfully completing will be registered for Algebra for the 2020-2021 school year.
