COVID PROCEDURE REMINDERS

As a reminder, students who are exhibiting any of the Covid-19 symptoms need to stay home. Our isolation room staff will contact you to discuss specific symptoms and situations. As a reminder all school age siblings should stay home if one child is exhibiting symptoms.

CLASS QUARANTINES

If your student is quarantined and unable to attend in-person school, virtual learning will be the mode of instructional delivery during the quarantine period. It will be important for students to access their Seesaw (Kindergarten-Grade 4) or Canvas (5th-6th Grade) account daily to retrieve and complete learning activities and assignments being prepared by their teacher. The classroom teacher will be communicating with students regularly throughout this quarantine period. Families are encouraged to reach out to the teacher with any academic related questions. School work provided during the quarantine period is counted toward your student's attendance and grade.

ATTENDANCE

School starts at **7:45**. If your child will be absent or late please call the school office 715.384.8181 as soon as possible. If your child is not called in, they will receive an unexcused absence. If you arrive to school tardy you will need to sign in at the office. In addition, if you are picking your student up early before the **2:50** dismissal, you will need to sign the child out in the school office as well. Any tardies, absences, or instances your child leaves early will be marked. Thank you for your cooperation with these policies.

FROM THE DISTRICT NURSES – SUMMER WELLNESS REMINDERS/ IMMUNIZATION INFO

Summer is an excellent time to schedule well child visits with your child's doctor or other medical provider. Although individuals may be hesitant to seek medical care at this time, local clinics have practices in place to ensure patient & family safety. Many clinics have set aside special areas strictly for visits such as well child checks & all visitors are screened.

Please keep in mind that Wisconsin law requires several immunizations for all students entering kindergarten and a tdap booster for those entering 6th grade. Summer is an excellent time to obtain any immunizations your child may need. You can contact your medical provider's office to determine which vaccines your child should have & to schedule immunization appointments.

As always, district nurses remain available to discuss any health related concerns you may have regarding your child. Do not hesitate to contact your child's school to speak to a nurse.

How do I complete the Student Immunization Record?



Call your doctor or local health department and make a **vaccine visit** by early summer.



Ask your doctor to **fill out** the Student Immunization Record and then you **sign** it.



Give the Student Immunization Record to the school at the beginning of the new school year.



Call your doctor's office or local health department if you **need help** or more information.
