Cold Weather Check List

Take some time to go over the following check list to see if your child is ready for the cold weather.

Another thing to stay on top of is making sure these clothes are dried daily. I highly recommend removing boot liners daily and placing them, along with mittens, near a heat source in your home to dry. *Imagine having to go outside with wet gloves and boots for 20 minutes when the wind-chill is in the single digits!*

SEND CLOTHING FOR OUTDOOR RECESS <u>EVERY DAY</u> EVEN IF YOU THINK IT MIGHT BE INDOOR RECESS!

Remember...all students will go outside for recess if the wind-chill is above 0 degrees. Playing outside in the winter can be lots of fun if you are dry and dressed appropriately.

Be sure to write your child's name on their outdoor clothing!

UNEXPECTED EARLY DISMISSALS

Tis' the season for unpredictable bad weather. With that in mind it is imperative that families are prepared for unexpected early dismissals. Be sure that your family has a plan in place of how your child(ren) will be getting home.

Please prepare your child with special directions in case school would be canceled during the school day. Does s/he know how to get into the house if you are not home? Does s/he know where to call you?

Cancellations will be posted on the radio, the District website, http://www.marshfieldschools.org, TV, and the Skylert Message System will be activated. Please do not inundate the school office with calls inquiring about cancellations without checking these other avenues first.

MY CHILD IS QUARANTINED...NOW WHAT?

If your student is quarantined and unable to attend in-person school, virtual learning will be the mode of instructional delivery during this quarantine period. It will be important for students to access their Seesaw (K-Grade 4) or Canvas (5th -6th Grade) Account daily to retrieve and complete learning activities and assignments being prepared by their teacher. The classroom teacher will be communicating with students regularly throughout this quarantine period. Families are encouraged to reach out to the teacher with any academic related questions.

School work provided during the quarantine period is counted toward your student's attendance. Students who do not complete the work will be marked absent.

FREE MEALS FOR VIRTUAL OR QUARANTINED STUDENTS

This is a reminder that families participating in virtual learning OR those who have students out on quarantine are eligible and encouraged to pick up student meals. Meal pick up is every Monday and Wednesday at the high school. We want to ensure that students not receiving meals in school are aware they have the option to pick up them up.

Wisconsin State Educational Accountability

As part of the Wisconsin state accountability system, the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) produces a report card for every public school and district in Wisconsin. The data included in a school's report card is retrieved from spring state assessments, daily attendance, and high school graduation rates. Since schools were not able to complete spring 2020 assessments due to COVID19 and school closures, DPI will not be releasing 2019-2020 report cards.
