## **WISCONSIN'S TORNADO AND SEVERE WEATHER AWARENESS WEEK**

**Tornado and Severe Weather Awareness Week is April 8-12, 2019  
Statewide Tornado Drill is April 11**

On Thursday, April 11, 2019, two statewide tornado drills are planned - one in the afternoon and one in the evening.

A mock tornado watch will be issued statewide by the NWS at 1:00 p.m. The NWS will follow with a statewide mock tornado warning at 1:45 p.m. The afternoon drill ends at 2:00 p.m. When conditions are favorable for severe

weather to develop, the National Weather Service (NWS) will issue a WATCH. When a Watch is issued, make sure you have a source of weather information in the event storms begin to form.

When severe weather has formed, NWS meteorologists will issue a WARNING to immediately alert the public about the dangerous weather and to advise them to seek appropriate shelter.

Watches and Warnings are relayed to local radio and television stations and are broadcast on NOAA Weather Radio.

Public safety officials also get the Warnings and can activate local warning systems, like outdoor sirens, to alert communities.
