

LEARNING TARGETS Elementary Art

GRADE 5

A. Creating

Students will investigate, plan and work through materials and ideas to make works of art and design.

- A.5.1. Employ the hollow form in clay to develop the craft and skills to produce quality art.
- A.5.2. Use complimentary color schemes in artwork to develop the craft and skills to produce quality art.
- A.5.3. Use proportion in drawing to develop the craft and skills to produce quality art.
- A.5.4. Indicate volume through the use of value and color to develop the craft and skills to product quality art.
- A.5.5. Develop ideas and carry through to completion of an original art making process.
- A.5.6. Use size, placement, and overlapping to show depth.
- A.5.7. Demonstrate gesture drawing to imply movement in figure drawing.
- A.5.8. Create a bas relief sculpture.
- A.5.9. Understand the difference between original art works, reproductions, and copies by using printmaking to express an original idea.

B. Presenting

Students will demonstrate that art communicates meaning through sharing their work and the work of others.

- **B.5.1.** Demonstrate that art work communicates meaning through sharing work and the work of others.
- B.5.2. Students will discuss and explain how art is presented in art museums and public places.

C. Responding

Students experience, analyze and interpret art and other aspects of the visual world.

- C.5.1. Learn basic vocabulary and language related to the study of art by identifying the parts of art: rhythm, complimentary color, bas relief sculpture, proportion and value.
- C.5.2. Know basic ways to describe, analyze, interpret, and judge art images from various cultures, artists, and designers by comparing and contrasting cultural uses of artworks from different times and places.
- C.5.3. Know that art communicates ideas and has meaning by exploring the work of master artists, M.C. Escher and Hokusai.
- C.5.4. Use art to understand how the artist feels by distorting and exaggerating to express a feeling.
- C.5.5. Reflect on artwork during the creative process to assess and better understand one's own artwork.
- C.5.6. Develop the ability to verbalize decision making during the art making process.

D. Connecting

Examine the capacities of media arts experiences and technologies for synthesizing meaning, and for reflecting and affecting culture.

- D.5.1. Demonstrate how Native Americans of the southwest used resources that were available to create art to understand basic styles of art from different parts of the world and different times.
- D.5.2. Examine environmentally conscious design in consumer products to begin to understand environmental and aesthetic issues related to consumer design.
- D.5.3. Know about artists and designers, such as furniture designers, critics, preservationists, museum curators, and gallery owners.
