 <p>Benchmark Distribution Report</p>	<p>The groups Benchmark Distribution report provides a way to view benchmark score distribution and ranges for a battery or single measures across a specified group (Account, District, School, Class, Group) in graphical format. The colored bands represent percentile ranks (11-89%ile). Side-by-side stacked bars make comparisons between the selected group and the comparison group. Table data provides details about the number and percentage of students in all five percentile ranges as well as mean scores and standard deviations for each group.</p> <p>*Must have at least 10 scores for the group selected in the Show area.  <p>Scores and Skills Plan Report</p>	<p>The groups Scores and Skills Plan report is used to view benchmark composite level and individual measure score ranges in a graphical format. The number and percentage of students who fell within each range is reported as well as the classroom median percentile rank. Narrative information about group's performance is provided. Comparisons can be made to national norms, local norms, or tiers. Students are ranked in order and placed into groups based on this comparison. View benchmark results by raw score or percentile rank relevant to norms selected. A quick view of monitoring goal status can be seen.
