

Learning Targets Elementary Music

GRADE 3

A. Creating

Generate and select among multiple musical ideas relevant to a personal experience, interest, or specific purpose.

A.3.1. Communicate musical ideas by composing short rhythmic and melodic phrases/ostinatos using previously learned rhythmic notation, adding whole rests.

B. Performing

Perform expressively, with appropriate interpretation and technical accuracy, and in a manner appropriate to the audience and context.

- **B.3.1.** Demonstrate musical achievement by performing for friends and family.
- B.3.2. Demonstrate understanding of tonality by performing music with diatonic solfege (Do, re, mi, fa, so, la, ti, do').
- **B.3.3.** Demonstrate understanding of harmony by singing rounds and partner songs with the group.
- B.3.4. Demonstrate the understanding of the flow of music by performing short rhythmic and melodic phrases/ostinatos using previously learned rhythmic notation, adding whole rests.

C. Responding

Support an interpretation of a work that reflects the creator/performer's expressive intent.

- C.3.1. Demonstrate the understanding of the visual representation of melody by identifying the lines and spaces of the treble staff by letter name.
- C.3.2. Recognize and respond to sixteenth note notation as well as dotted half notes and dotted quarter-eighth note patterns to demonstrate the relationship between notes and subdivision of beat.
- C.3.3. Demonstrate the understanding of pulse by recognizing and responding to meter in 2, 3, and 4.
- C.3.4. Identify and respond to symbols of notation including: staff, treble clef, time signature, bar lines, and measures to communicate musical ideas.
- C.3.5. Identify, perform, and respond to symbols and terms that show expression in music.
- C.3.6. Identify and perform AB, ABA, AABA forms; introduction and coda; DS al Fine, and DC al Fine to demonstrate the understanding of musical form.
- C.3.7. Demonstrate the understanding of visual representation of music by reading short rhythmic and melodic phrases/ostinatos using previously learned rhythmic notation, adding whole rests.

D. Connecting

Examine the capacities of media arts experiences and technologies for synthesizing meaning, and for reflecting and affecting culture.

- D.3.1. Appreciate music's role in American and world culture by singing and experiencing a diverse repertoire of music.
- **D.3.2.** Understand the connection of multiple elements of fine arts by studying the opera "Hansel and Gretel".
