

# Learning Targets Elementary Music GRADE 4

## A. Creating

Generate and select among multiple musical ideas relevant to a personal experience, interest, or specific purpose.

- A.4.1 Communicate musical ideas by composing short rhythmic and melodic phrases using previously learned rhythmic notation, adding syncopation.
- A.4.2 Communicate musical ideas by creating and notating a diatonic melody.
- A.4.3 Create rondo form (ABACA) to demonstrate understanding of musical form.

## **B.** Performing

Perform expressively, with appropriate interpretation and technical accuracy, and in a manner appropriate to the audience and context.

- **B.4.1** Demonstrate musical achievement by performing for friends and family.
- **B.4.2** Demonstrate the understanding of harmony by singing rounds and partner songs with the group.
- **B.4.3** Demonstrate increased musical independence by performing short rhythmic and melodic phrases using previously learned rhythmic notation, including syncopation.

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### C. Responding

Support an interpretation of a work that reflects the creator/performer's expressive intent.

- C.4.1 Identify, perform, and respond to symbols and terms that show expression in music.
- C.4.2 Demonstrate understanding of musical notation by identifying accidentals and leger lines.
- C.4.3 Recognize the differences in timbre by identifying and responding to instruments in the String family.
- C.4.4 Recognize an American form and style by responding to 12 Bar Blues (AAB form).
- C.4.5 Demonstrate the understanding of musical form by identifying rondo form.
- C.4.6 Identify the white keys of the piano key School Board by letter name.
- C.4.7 Understand musical notation by performing a melody written on the treble staff.
