Course Name: Concert Choir

Length of Course: Year

Credits: 1 Credit

# Course Description:

Concert Choir is centered around a challenging level of music. Students will perform music for concerts, solo & ensemble festival, madrigal dinner, graduation and support of home athletic events. This course may only be dropped during the first 4 weeks of the school year.

Prerequisites: Sophomore standing (audition), Junior, Senior standing (Director placement)

# Learning Targets:

After completing this course, students will be able to:

- Demonstrate an open, resonant, full tone in most registers and ranges.
- Demonstrate improved breath support.
- Demonstrate accurate intonation in all ranges and registers. Pitch adjustments are made with help from director.
- Demonstrate high level of accuracy with all notes, rhythms, and text.
- Demonstrate consistently appropriate posture (seated or standing)
- Demonstrate high level of expression with accurate style elements, interpretation, phrasing, dynamics and tempo.
- Demonstrate the ability to watch and respond to the director throughout the performance.
- Demonstrate that they understand and can implement the importance of: respect for others and rules; being prepared for class and performances; being an active participant in rehearsals and performances; seeking improvement through independent practice.
- Demonstrate their ability to dress, carry themselves, and perform in a precise and deliberate manner
